Governor Reappoints Alpine Waste & Recycling Exec

Orloff to serve another three years on Solid and Hazardous Waste Commission

COMMERCE CITY, Colo. (Nov. 10, 2011) — Alek M. Orloff, chief financial officer of [Alpine Waste & Recycling](#), has been reappointed by Governor John Hickenlooper to serve another three-year term on Colorado's Solid and Hazardous Waste Commission.

Established in 1992, the panel ensures that the state's hazardous waste rules are consistent with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's requirements, preserving Colorado's authorization and federal funds, and that the rules governing solid waste disposal sites are protective of human health and the environment. It is a branch of the [Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment](#).

"My participation on this commission allows me to serve the State of Colorado and complements Alpine Waste & Recycling's commitment to environmental stewardship," Orloff said. "It is a rewarding assignment, and I am grateful to Gov. Hickenlooper for the continued opportunity."

The [Solid and Hazardous Waste Commission](#) is comprised of nine gubernatorial appointees: three members from industry; three members from the public at large; and three members from government or academia. The commission adopts rules pertaining to solid and hazardous waste and hears appeals on administrative penalties for hazardous waste matters.
